## A Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, Attala, Leake, Monroe, Oktibeha, Smith, Warren and Yazoo counties and other parts of the State of Mississippi were severely affected by severe thunderstorms and tornadoes that occurred on November 29 and 30, 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, this storm system damaged homes, businesses, private and public property, and caused injuries within these areas of the State of Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, in consideration of the health and safety of the residents and the protection of their property within the affected areas, and in the public interest, all steps should be taken to protect people and property:


**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me under the Constitution of the State of Mississippi and Section 33-15-11(b)(17), Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and in the public interest and for the general welfare, do hereby proclaim a State of Emergency to exist in the areas of the State of Mississippi affected by this severe weather system. The provisions of this proclamation shall exist and remain in effect until such time as this threat to public safety shall cease to exist as prescribed in Section 33-15-11(b)(17), Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

**FURTHER**, all agencies of the State of Mississippi shall discharge their emergency responsibilities as deemed necessary as set forth in the State of Mississippi Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.




**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, I have herunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Mississippi to be affixed.
