## A Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, the National Weather Service and the National Hurricane Center predict the State of Mississippi, including but not limited to the counties of George, Hancock, Harrison, Jackson, Marion, Pearl River and Stone, may be severely affected by Tropical Depression 13, which may become Tropical Storm Lee, and may include torrential rains, damaging winds, severe thunderstorms, flooding and possibly tornadoes, and which may require the sheltering of evacuees from other states, and thus state assistance will be necessary to support local government response and recovery efforts; and

**WHEREAS**, this tropical weather system may cause damage to homes, businesses, public property, and threaten the safety of the citizens and property throughout the State of Mississippi; and


**WHEREAS**, in consideration of the health and safety of the residents and the protection of their property within the affected areas, and in the public interest, all steps should be taken to protect people and property.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me under the Constitution of the State of Mississippi and Section 33-15-11(b)(17), Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and in the public interest and for the general welfare, do hereby proclaim a State of Emergency to exist in the areas of the State of Mississippi affected by, or areas that may be affected by, this tropical weather system. The provisions of this proclamation shall exist and remain in effect until such time as this threat to public safety shall cease to exist as prescribed in Section 33-15-11(b)(17), Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

**FURTHER**, all agencies of the State of Mississippi shall discharge their emergency responsibilities as deemed necessary as set forth in the State of Mississippi's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.


**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Mississippi to be affixed.
