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### DISASTER SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR VICTIMS OF THE APRIL 15 - 28, 2011 SEVERE WEATHER

PEARL-The Mississippi Department of Human Services has been authorized to implement the DISASTER SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM to assist victims of the severe weather on April 15 - 28, 2011 in **Chickasaw, Choctaw, Clarke, Jasper, Lafayette, Monroe, Neshoba and Webster Counties**. Affected residents must have incurred disaster related expenses as a direct result of the severe weather to be eligible for the one-time only benefit. Current SNAP recipients are not eligible for DSNAP benefits.

- **When to Apply:** Wednesday, May 11, 2011 through Friday, May 13, 2011 from 9:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. each day.

- **Who May Apply:** A responsible adult household member may apply for the family.
- **Who is Eligible:** The household must have lived in one of the above counties affected by the severe weather. The household must also have suffered a loss of income, or damage to home, property or self-employment business and meet DSNAP income limits.

*To determine the household's monthly income, the net income (take-home pay) from wages or self-employment, assistance payments and other unearned income, such as Social Security or child support, that a household receives will be added to cash on hand and other accessible funds (such as money in checking and savings accounts). Compare your monthly income and household size to the following income limits.*

Number in Household and Income Limit	
1 - \$2186	5 - \$4254
2 - \$2847	6 - \$4753
3 - \$3272	7 - \$5116
4 - \$3859	8 - \$5479

- **Benefit Levels:** Eligible households will receive a one-month allotment of food assistance benefits.
- **Verification Needed:** Individuals applying for disaster food assistance need to bring documents to prove their identity.
