## **CLAIBORNE COUNTY DISASTER RECOVERY CENTER TO CLOSE; HELP IS STILL AVAILABLE**

**CLINTON, Miss.** – The Disaster Recovery Center in Claiborne County will close at 2 p.m. on Saturday, June 18, but survivors of the Mississippi River flooding still can get help.

Those who already have registered with FEMA can visit another center in Mississippi or call FEMA's Helpline at **800-621-FEMA (3362)**.

The center closing in Claiborne County is at the William Ross Administration Bldg., 504 Market St., Port Gibson.

The DRC in adjacent Warren County remains open *from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday.* That DRC is located at the previous All Pro Auto Sales, 2127 Washington St., Vicksburg.

Centers are staffed with emergency management experts from the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, Federal Emergency Management Agency, U.S. Small Business Administration and other agencies who can answer questions about disaster assistance programs.

Before visiting a center, people with storm-related losses should register with FEMA by calling **800-621-FEMA (3362)** or online at [www.DisasterAssistance.gov](http://www.DisasterAssistance.gov). Help is available in most languages. People with mobile devices can register at [m.fema.gov](http://m.fema.gov).

Mississippians also can register using (TTY) **800-462-7585** or videophone via 711, the Mississippi Relay Service. FEMA will assist anyone with a disability who needs help registering—just ask.

However, applicants who receive SBA loan applications must submit them to SBA loan officers to be eligible for assistance that covers personal property, vehicle repair or replacement, and moving and storage expenses.*
