CLAY COUNTY DISASTER RECOVERY CENTER TO CLOSE; HELP IS STILL AVAILABLE

CLINTON, Miss. – The Disaster Recovery Center in Clay County will close at 7 p.m. on Friday, June 3, but tornado and storm survivors still can get help. Those who already have registered with FEMA can visit other centers in Mississippi or call FEMA’s Helpline at **800-621-FEMA (3362)**.

Centers are staffed with emergency management experts from the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, Federal Emergency Management Agency, U.S. Small Business Administration and other agencies who can answer questions about disaster assistance programs.

The center that is closing is at the Pheba Voting Precinct, 21523 Hwy 50 West, Pheba. The DRC in adjacent Monroe County remains open *from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday* and is located at the Government Complex Bldg, 1619 Highland Ave. in Amory.

Before visiting a center, people with storm-related losses should register with FEMA by calling **800-621-FEMA (3362)** or online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov. Help is available in most languages. Those with speech or hearing disabilities can call (TTY) **800-462-7585**.

Persons affected by the storms and tornadoes also can apply for federal assistance through a web-enabled mobile device or smartphone. Visit m.fema.gov and follow the link to apply online for federal assistance and other recovery help.

FEMA's temporary housing assistance and grants for public transportation expenses, medical and dental expenses, and funeral and burial expenses do not require individuals to apply for an SBA loan. However, applicants who receive SBA loan applications must submit them to SBA loan officers to be eligible for assistance that covers personal property, vehicle repair or replacement, and moving and storage expenses.
