PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi regularly experiences the effects of severe weather, and throughout history, numerous lives have been lost, and untold amounts of damage have been caused by severe weather; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi experienced 82 tornadoes in 2020, three of which were EF4s in a span of eight days in April 2020, the most severe tornadoes in Mississippi history; and

WHEREAS, nearly 25% of all recorded Mississippi tornadoes occur during the State's secondary severe weather season; and

WHEREAS, Mississippians should be aware that they can take an active role in improving their ability to survive and recover from hurricanes by having a NOAA Weather Radio and knowing what to do when severe weather threatens; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency and the National Weather Service are urging Mississippians to be prepared for the upcoming fall season that usually produces an increased amount of severe weather and tornadoes;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim October 18, 2021 – October 22, 2021 as:

FALL SEVERE WEATHER PREPAREDNESS WEEK

in the State of Mississippi and encourage all of our citizens to join in this effort to increase public awareness and to increase public preparedness to save lives and property when our state is affected by severe weather and tornadoes:
