## **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi regularly experiences the effects of severe weather, and throughout the State's history numerous lives have been lost and tremendous economic damage has been caused by severe weather; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi experienced 137 confirmed tornadoes in 2022, a record number for the state; and

WHEREAS, 96 confirmed tornadoes occurred in Mississippi in 2022 during the spring months; and

WHEREAS, history has demonstrated that well-informed and well-prepared citizens sustain less personal injury and fewer economic damages as a result of tornados and other severe weather; and

WHEREAS, Mississippians should be aware that they can take an active role in improving their ability to survive and recover from severe weather by having a NOAA Weather Radio or multiple ways to receive warnings and knowing what to do when severe weather threatens; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency continues to prepare for tomorrow's disasters today through education focused on individuals, families, and communities; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency and the National Weather Service are urging Mississippians to be prepared for the upcoming spring season that usually produces an increased amount of tornados and other severe weather.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim February 20 through February 25, 2023, as:
