FEMA's map contractor reviews all floodplain studies, prepares maps for final production, and maintains archives of backup for all Flood Insuranæ Studies and computer models used to make the maps.

Requesting Flood Insurance Study Backup

If you need to request backup material, contact the State NFIP Coordinator, FEMA Region IV, or check on FEMA's website. There are seven categories of backup materials, ranging from copies of topographic work maps to electronic copies of hydrologic and hydraulic models, and copies of individual Letters of Map Change to copies of user manuals for the computer models used by FEMA contractors. A fee is charged based on the materials requested and the time required to prepare and send the request.

FEMA Publications

FEMA has a large number of publications about floodplain management, flood insurance, and post-flood mitigation. If you know the publication title or number, you may order by calling (800) 480-2520.

If you have access to the Internet, the easiest way to learn more is to go to FEMA's website, **www.fema.gov**, and click on Mitigation. In the banner, you'll see "library" which will take you to a layout from which you can select many different topics. Click on the "mitigation room" and a long list of publications will appear. Some of them can be viewed on-line, but many can be downloaded if you have Adobe Acrobat (available for downloading from the FEMA web site).
